Seventh International MANGA Award

On 21 March, Minister for Foreign Affairs Mr Fumio Kishida announced this year's International MANGA AWARD schedule. The Foreign Minister serves as the Chairman of the Seventh International MANGA Award Executive Committee.

The International MANGA Award was established in May 2007 at the initiative of then-Minister for Foreign Affairs Mr Taro Aso with the aim of awarding MANGA creators who contribute to the spread of MANGA culture overseas.

It has been held every year since its establishment. This year, the International MANGA Award Executive Committee again decided to hold the award.

Guidelines for the entry and the entry form are available on the Ministry of Foreign Affairs website.

Applications should be sent to your closest Japanese diplomatic missions (Sydney for our readers) or the post office box of the Seventh International MANGA Award directly.

The best MANGA from among all of the submitted works will be awarded the Gold Award. The next three best MANGA shall receive the Silver Award. Recipients will be invited to Japan by the Japan Foundation to attend the award ceremony. During their stay in Japan, they will also have the chance to exchange opinions with Japanese MANGA creators and to visit publishing companies and other places.
