# What is JET?

- The Japan Exchange and Teaching Programme
- Provides a unique opportunity to live and work in Japan
- Started by the Japanese Government in 1987
- Over 80,000 people from 82 countries have participated in the program


## **Three Roles**

## ALT

### **Assistant Language Teacher**

外国語指導助手

ALTs team-teach English in Japanese schools.

Great role for people who:

- Enjoy working with children
- Have a confident grasp of English
- Can share about their own country/culture
- Want to be actively involved with schools and local communities





## CIR

### **Coordinator for International Relations**

国際交流員

CIRs work for local government offices.

Great role for people who:

- Can communicate in English and Japanese
- Are interested in translation/interpreting and international exchange
- Are willing to get involved with different community projects





## SEA

## **Sports Exchange Advisor**

スポーツ国際交流員

SEAs assist with sports training.

Great role for people who:

- Have expertise in particular sports
- Are enthusiastic about promoting internationalisation through sports
- Can assist with planning sports-related projects

# Contract Overview

### Remuneration

Per annum, before taxes



**1st Year** - 4,020,000 yen



**2nd Year** - 4,140,000 yen



3rd Year - 4,260,000 yen



4th Year - 4,320,000 yen



**5th Year** - 4,320,000 yen

### **Travel Expenses**

Flights to Japan and transport to your contracting organisation are covered by the Programme. Once you finish your time on the Programme, if you choose to move back to Australia your return flights are also covered.

### **Work Hours**

Participants are required to work 35 hours per week. You will have weekends off, in addition to Japanese public holidays. All participants are entitled to at least 10 days of annual paid leave.

### **Contract Length**

One year starting from the day after your arrival in Japan. If both you and the Contracting Organisation agree, it can be renewed up to 4 times (5 years in total).



### Insurance

All JET participants are covered by four types of insurance. Three are compulsory, set by the Japanese government. The fourth is a private insurance policy for JET Programme participants.


